The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences (UAMS) offers graduate training in Pharmaceutical Evaluation and Policy resulting in a M.S. degree. What is unique about our program is that we have the ability to offer graduate Research Assistantships with annual stipend of more than \$19,000/year that includes a tuition waiver that we make available to our top applicants. Our graduate program accepted its first class of students in the Fall of 2005 and thus far, all of our graduates have been able to find employment prior to graduation in the field for which they have been trained and have been offered starting salaries in the \$60,000 - \$90,000 range.

This discipline may not be known to many students and faculty outside the medical professions and this is why I am writing to you. We feel that your program may have the right students to enter our graduate training program. Enclosed is a brochure describing our program.
